School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Jere Whitson Elementary School will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. JWES values the contributions and involvement of families to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that JWES will support family engagement and how families can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it revised?

Jere Whitson Elementary School invites parents, teachers, and community members to family engagement meetings throughout the year to review and revise this parent and family engagement policy, our family-school compacts, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, family input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year through the family-friendly survey, which is distributed annually online and through paper copies. The plan is also posted on our school website for families to review throughout the year. All feedback received will be used to revise the plan for the next school year.

Why do we need it?

All students enrolled in a Title I school and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan.

Where is it available?

This plan is given to all students at the beginning of the year, as well as new students when they enroll. The plan is on the school website, and families may also request an additional copy at any time during the school year.

What is Title I?

Jere Whitson Elementary School is identified as a Title I School as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support state and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging state academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop, with parents and family members, a written parent and family engagement policy.

All Means All: JWES will provide a well-rounded, comprehensive approach to help meet the needs of the whole child.

Improve College and Career Readiness: JWES will support the district goal by delivering strong instruction and having high expectations to support student growth and achievement in order to enhance and increase future ACT scores and graduation rates. Through early career education, we will inspire JWES students to be college and career ready.

Academic Success for All: The instructional focus at JWES is for all students to perform at grade-level across all subject areas. Individual student needs will be met by differentiating instruction within the classroom and providing a tiered approach to intervention services. JWES will support teachers in delivering strong instruction using district approved, high quality curricular materials that incorporate engaging, grade-appropriate tasks and assignments. Student annual performance will reflect both increased achievement and growth as a result of strengthened instruction.

Empowering and Supporting Parents

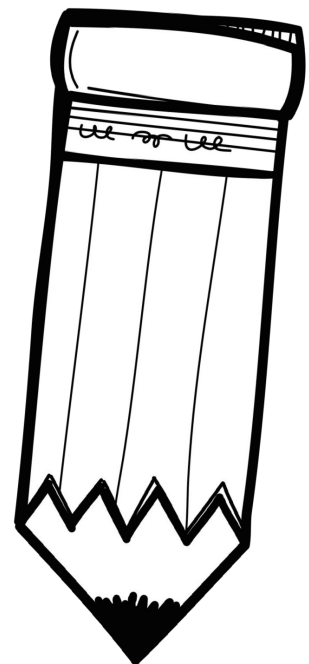
Jere Whitson Elementary School will take the following measures to empower and support parents and family members as an important foundation of our school in order to strengthen the school and reach our goals.

We will:

- Ensure that all information related to school and family programs, workshops, meetings, and other activities is published in both English and Spanish and posted on the school website calendar.
- Partner with early childhood programs, middle and high schools, college and career ready resources or organizations, parent resource centers, or other programs to help prepare parents and their children for successful school transitioning.
- Share information in English and Spanish for families to understand the school's academic standards and assessments, as well as ways families can monitor their child's progress and work with educators.
- Communicate with all families and the community on a regular basis regarding school-wide events and activities using flyers, newsletters, our website, social media, and School Messenger.
- Provide necessary materials and handouts for parents at conferences, meetings, workshops, and activities to help parents work with their child to improve their child's achievement.
- Collect feedback from parents and family members at all events, during all committee meetings, and through the annual Family-Friendly Survey.

Family-School Compacts

As part of this plan, Jere Whitson Elementary School and our families have developed a family-school compact for each grade-level (K-4). A compact is a written agreement that families, teachers, and students jointly develop to explain how everyone will work together and share responsibility for improved student achievement. The compacts will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from families, students, and teachers during various events, meetings, and the annual Family-Friendly Survey. The family-school compacts are also discussed in each classroom, are shared with parents during parent-teacher conferences, are posted on our school website, and extra copies are always available upon request.
